Canadian Awards

Canada has several certificates that are easy to earn even with poor propagation. Several contests encourage such contacts — the Sweepstakes, CQ NAQP, and Spring and Winter RAC contests. The Candaward certificate is the main one. Information on all of the certificates is on their web site at <http://www.rac.ca/service/awards.htm>

Canadaward is issued to any Amateur who confirms two-way QSO's with CANADIAN Amateur stations located in each of the Canadian Provinces and Territories. All QSO's must be on one band only. Separate awards will be issued for each band and mode on which the applicant qualifies. (13 cards are required for each band/mode).

The 5 Band Canadaward special engraved plaque is available to any Amateur who confirms two-way QSO's with CANADIAN Amateur stations located in each of the Canadian Provinces and Territories on each of five (5) separate bands. (Total of sixty (65) cards: Thirteen (13) cards per band.

All amateur bands may be used. Each distinct satellite mode will count as a separate band.

Do not send QSL cards. Have them certified by two other radio amateurs. Cards must be in possession of applicant. Subject to random check.

Application form available on the website, or upon request to RAC HQ with SASE.

Only contacts made after July 1, 1977 will count for this award.

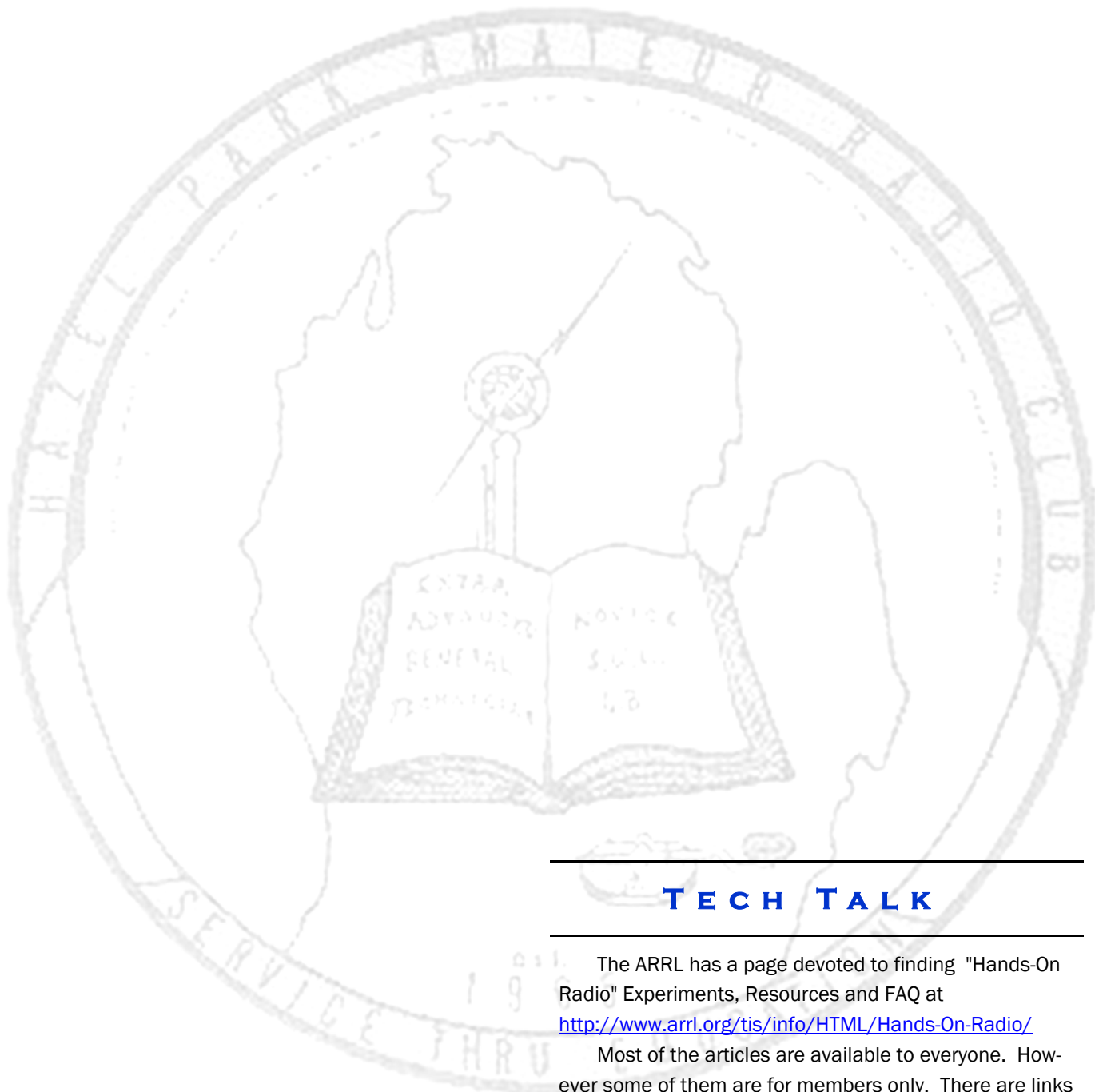
His article is an excellent article for the HF newbie (or even the experienced operator and I could not have written something as clearly myself and so I reprinted it here.

A survey is in the process of being written and will be sent to all of the members. The goal is gather information so that the Board can better understand the membership and how they see the club. IOTA WEBSITE

The RSGB's premier DX award scheme, Islands on the Air, launched its new website that includes many innovative improvements. It contains many new features including the ability to view one's own record of island groups confirmed. Soon it will be possible for participants to claim additional credits on-line and even to claim credit for IOTA Contest QSOs without the need for QSL card verification.

The site, at www.rsgbiota.org, has proved already to be a great success. Within the first week, 34,308 pages were viewed (an average of about 4,900 per day) by users in 64 different countries, with the homepage, search page and island group information pages the most popular. 383 users registered to use the QSO credits part of the site, of whom 163 were new to the IOTA program, proving the value of moving to an on-line management system.

The site was developed primarily by Dominic Smith, M0BLF, with Martin Atherton, G3ZAY, acting as the liaison between the project team and the IOTA Committee.

% Those persons with old IS-195 certification will be grandfathered to both the IS-100 and IS-200 classes.

The old IS-2 class will count as the newer IS-22.

- November 10 2007, IS-100: "Introduction to Incident Command System."
- December 15 2007, IS-700: "National Incident Management System (NIMS): An Introduction." Students need to pass IS-100 in order to take this course.

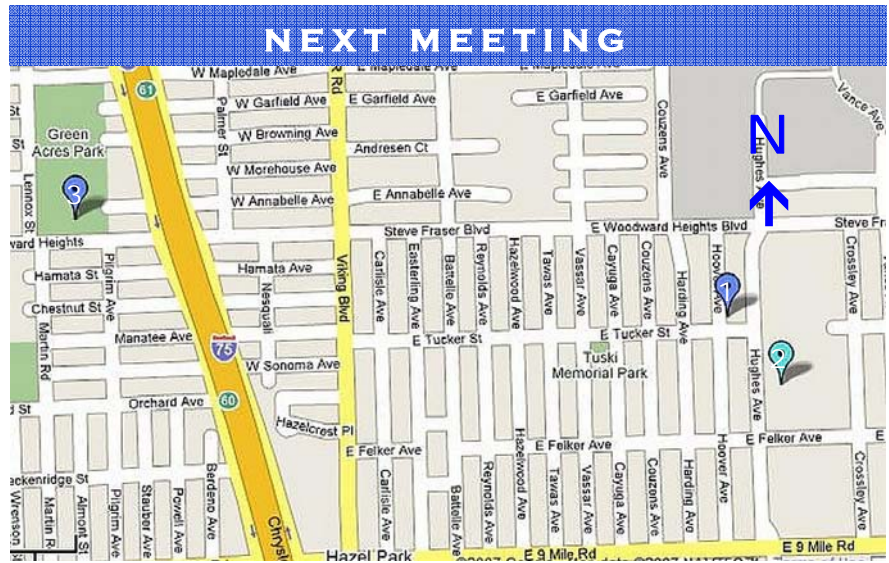
