different modes including voice (SSB), CW (Morse code) and Digital (RTTY, PSK and more). Some are on the High frequency bands, some on the VHF-UHF bands and microwave bands and some are on the Satellites.

If you are chasing after awards or DX contacts contests this is a place to make a lot of needed contacts in a hurry even if you are not really in the contest! QST is a good place for information on contests. There is a page in QST every month that list all the major contest information for that month.

CQ magazine also is a good source for contest information. Just go at your own pace and have fun. Remember the old pro's had to start somewhere and were not always old pros. (Sometimes some of them forget that!) From the Amateur's Code: "The Radio Amateur is **CONSIDERATE**...never knowingly operates in such a way as to lessen the pleasure of others." This is from an ARRL publication. I will be putting a different part of it in my monthly QRM until completing the whole code.

Summer is almost here. The banquet is in June, of course you are going? Field day weekend is the last weekend in June. The club picnic is the second Wednesday in August. Remember the club is here to help each other. If you have antenna work you need help with or some other amateur radio related project let someone know.

Oakland County ARPSC has approved new membership definitions.

ARES member: Basic membership is any licensed amateur radio operator . No extra classes required.

RACES member: Licensed amateur radio operator who has taken IS 2 or IS 22 and had a background check by Oakland County. (IS 22 is available online at <http://training.fema.gov/EMIWeb/IS/is22.asp>)

File of Life

West Bloomfield Fire Department and EMS Services have teamed up with Henry Ford Hospital – West Bloomfield to promote "File of Life." This gives a person's medical information, and is enclosed in a magnetized packet for placement on a refrigerator. A wallet insert also exists. Medical information includes an individual's diagnosis, medicines, doctors with phone numbers, insurance, allergies, etc.

A special sticker is included for the person's front window to let EMS know a "File of Life" exists inside. Too often, the EMS arrives on an emergency scene without any information as to what the medical problem might be. The "File of Life" permits EMS personnel to more quickly size up the problem and begin treatment.

This packet also is excellent for persons who don't speak English. It is suggested any information be written in pencil so that it can be updated every six months or so. Use separate packets for additional persons in a house. Other communities are aware about the "File of Life" and a number of EMS/FDs are encouraging this refrigerator packet, such as West Bloomfield, Hazel Park, Southfield, Allen Park, Southgate, Romulus, and Bloomfield Township. If you live in a different community, visit your local officials and see if they can start the program.

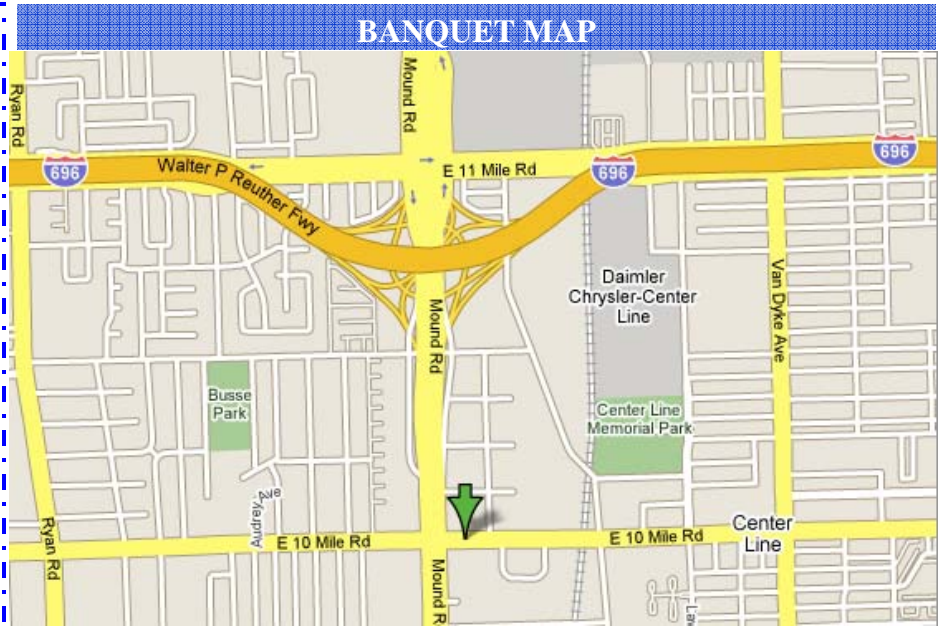
