# SENATE DEBATES

S. 1755 Reported from Committee

The US Senate version of **The Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Enhancement Act of 2009**was reported by voice vote from the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee. The next stop is the Senate floor.

Stand by for information on how you can help move this bill forward through the full Senate. S. 1755 and companion bill HR 2160 in the US House are the first steps toward overcoming excessively-restrictive codes, covenants and restrictions (CC&Rs) in real estate contracts.

These CC&Rs ban amateurs from erecting antennas in ever-increasing numbers of private housing developments in the US.

HR 2160 still needs our support. Please write to your representative in the US House of Representatives urging him to support this bill.

# RESCUE HAMSAT

#### Indonesia to Launch Rescue Radio HamSat

The Bernama dot com on line newspaper reports that the Indonesian Amateur Radio Organization called Orari and the Indonesian National Institute of Aeronautic and Space plan to launch the ham radio bird next year. But so far the president of the Orari has not revealed the satellite's size nor its orbital distance from Earth.

According to the website, the new ham radio bird will be used to expand the nation's ham radio communication network to remote districts. It went on to note that the satellite will play a major role in linking land, sea and air communication for rescue radio operations.

The article also noted that ham radio operators from Orari had become the alternative communication tool during disasters like the tsunami in Aceh and the recent earthquake in Padang. [source: Amateur Radio Newsline Report 1683]

If you check the email announcements or DX lists, you'll see who's going to be operating the contest. Pay close attention to which ones say they'll be working before and/or after the contest and which bands or frequencies.

Another thing you can do is check to see if you hear anyone the day/evening before the contest. Many times they are testing antennas and radios.

If you are a CW operator but don't have time to work the contest, then this is a good time to get them when they switch to CW to limber up for the contest. In any case, it never hurts to through out your own CQ while you have the radio on and see if you can get your own pile up going.

## VANITY CALL RULES?

On Wednesday, November 25, the FCC issued a *Notice* of *Proposed Rule Making* (*NPRM*) – <u>WT Docket No. 09-209</u> – seeking to amend the Commission's Amateur Radio Service rules to clarify certain rules and codify existing procedures governing the vanity call sign system, as well as revise certain rules applicable to club stations.

In its NPRM, the Commission said that it is their belief "that the public interest will be served by amending certain rules in order to make the Amateur Service's vanity call sign system more equitable and transparent. We also propose changes in the rules governing club station licensing, to promote equitable and administratively efficient processes.

We therefore seek comment on these proposed rule changes. In addition, we invite commenters to propose any other amendments to the rules governing the vanity call sign system and club station licensing."

The comment period for <u>WT Docket No. 09-209</u> will extend for 60 days after it is published in the *Federal Register*. Historically, items appear in the *Federal Register* approximately 7-10 days after they appear on the FCC Web site. Reply comments can be made up to 75 days after publication in the *Federal Register*. Information on how to make comments can be found in the <u>NPRM</u>.

## DOWNLOAD WEBINAR

The October webinar was great. ARRL General Counsel Chris Imlay, W3KD and ARRL Regulatory Manager, Dan Henderson, N1ND discussed Section 97.113 of the FCC rules, including the recent Public Notice that clarified this section. Several excellent questions were asked by participants.

# IPHONE EXAM APP

ARRL announces iPhone and iPod Touch "Apps" -- named <u>ARRL Technician</u>, <u>ARRL General</u> and <u>ARRL Extra</u>. They function as an electronic version of practice exam flash cards. The ARRL apps are available for \$1.99 each on Apple's iTunes "App Store."

Amateur Radio exam candidates can use the applications as a study companion to the <u>ARRL license manuals</u> and classroom instruction. The apps include all the possible questions and answers that will be on each of the license tests. Users can flag questions that need more review, segment questions for study by sub-element, or even study the questions in a random order.

## ANTENNA ON ISS

ARISS US Hardware Manager Lou McFadin, W5DID says that all the teamwork and effort to expand the ARISS amateur radio station aboard the ISS were successful this weekend. . . the new dual band 2m/70CM antenna was installed on the outside of ESA's Columbus module.

Lou congratulated the team, "This is an example of what can be achieved by volunteer hams working closely with a space agency. This antenna project was funded entirely by **AMSAT-NA** and volunteers who built the antennas for both an ESA experiment and for ARISS. I am very proud of all the teamwork and effort that has gone into this project."

The new ARISS antenna is very similar to the antennas already on the Russian service module. [With]the antennas in place the ARISS team will be working to bring amateur radio to the Columbus module.

In conclusion Lou noted the tremendous contribution from ESA for the experiment, the launch and the EVA making this expansion of amateur radio aboard the ISS possible.


