TERRILL'S ESTATE

Terrill Youngman K8MAR's daughter, Sheri Youngman, identified various electronic and ham radio related items at his house in Troy. Some were projects that were in QST and the handbook quite a few years back.

There are two older "complete stations", It may be for the 144 MHz band. One of them is built into cabinets and all of the different pieces are still connected and packed in a box. The other one is composed of four individual chassis that appear to be an exciter, amplifier, modulator, (a pair of 807 tubes), and a power supply. The receiver used with that one is a KnightKit, with a converter. There is also a regulated high voltage power supply that may have been used with one of the systems.

DIGITAL = BAUDOT (45.45 baud), BPSK31 and MFSK16 in a revolving schedule.

Code practice texts are from QST, and the source of each practice is given at the beginning of each practice and at the beginning of alternate speeds.

On Tuesdays and Fridays at 2230 UTC (6:30 PM ET), Keplerian Elements for active amateur satellites are sent on the regular digital frequencies.

A DX bulletin replaces or is added to the regular bulletins between 0000 UTC (8 PM ET)

Thursdays and 0000 UTC (8 PM ET) Fridays.

In a communications emergency, monitor

W1AW for special bulletins as follows: Voice on the hour, Digital at 15 minutes past the hour, and CW on the half hour.

FCC licensed amateurs may operate the station from 1400 UTC to 1600 UTC (10 AM to 12 PM ET), and then from 1700 UTC to 1945 UTC (1 PM to

3:45 PM ET) Monday through Friday. Be sure to bring your current FCC amateur license or a photocopy.

The complete W1AW Operating Schedule may be found on pin the March 2011 issue of QST or on the web at, http://www.arrl.org/w1aw-operating-schedule.

Also, just a reminder that beginning, March 15, 2010, W1AW alternates the digital modes used for its digital bulletin transmissions. While Baudot, BPSK31 and MFSK16 still make up the digital mode complement, the schedule is altered to give more exposure to BPSK31 and MFSK16. Because of time constraints and the varying lengths of digital bulletins, there were many instances in the past when only Baudot was used.

With the new schedule, amateurs preferring either BPSK31 or MFSK16 will find these modes no longer secondary.

The regular callup is made using the mode that is transmitted first.

The digital bulletin times remain at 6 PM and 9 PM eastern, daily.

The Tuesday and Friday Keplerian data bulletins will continue to be sent using just Baudot and BPSK31.

Given time constraints and bulletin lengths, all three modes may not always be transmitted.
