We meet for breakfast around 8 a.m. at Big Boy on Baldwin Rd. near Great Lakes Crossing on North I-75.

Then we continue on to the Field Day site. Setup begins at 10 a.m. sharp. We need all the time we can to get these 7 stations on the air by 2 p.m. The contest runs for 24 hours, until 2 p.m. Sunday.

We plan to have lots of rigs in action. 6 - HF stations, and 1 VHF station, running phone, CW, and digital. The "GOTA" station is set aside for new hams. We have a schedule for operating the other station, but there's always a lot of time open for walk-ins.

Even if you are bashful, and don't operate, there's lots of equipment to set up and tear down. We usually start teardown after lunch on Sunday. This is great fun for the techies.

We'll have two HF beams, 6 & 2 meter Yagis, plus my favorite, lots of dipoles.

Get free operator Elmering, coaching for beginners, Watch Mike, WD8S, in action, or Gerry the CW master. Or maybe you would like to just log for awhile. You can do that too! The excitement of contesting is everywhere at the Field Day site.

# DIRECTIONS

Camp Hazelwood is about 45 miles and 50 minutes from Hazel Park.

- 1. Take I-75 north about 40 miles.
- (Breakfast is at Baldwin Rd North, exit 84A, about halfway. Turn right at end of exit ramp; look to your left for the Big Boy sign. It's very close to the freeway)
- 3. Exit at Grange Hall Rd, exit 101, then turn right.
- 4. Drive 1 mile east to Dixie Highway, then turn left.
- 5. Drive 1.5 miles north on Dixie Highway. Pass Groveland Oaks Park on the right and Mt. Holly ski area on the left.
- 6. About 1/4 mile past the Mt. Holly entrance, look for Holdridge Rd. on the left. This is a gravel road with a convenience store at the corner. Turn left.
- 7. Camp Hazelwood is 3/4 mile down Holdridge Rd. on the right.

Alternate route: Take Dixie Hwy, exit 93, then turn right. Drive north 9 miles to Holdridge Rd.

# FOR SALE

From a local ham's estate...

#### Kenwood TS-520 5-Band Amateur Transceiver \$100

This transceiver has been tested by HPARC member Steve Gladstein, N8FH. The radio was connected to a multiband dipole and tested for reception. Reception worked well on all bands, including 10MHz WWV. The internal speaker is operational.

The transmitter was tested with a power meter and Cantenna dummy load. Power output was 100 watts on the lower bands, and dropped to 80 watts on the higher bands. The final amplifier was neutralized before testing. A frequency counter with antenna showed the output frequency was very stable. No microphone was available for testing.

This Kenwood TS520 Transceiver includes a built-in power supply for 120v AC operation, and a 12v converter for mobile operation. The SSB filter is in place, but the CW filter is not present. The manual is also included. No microphone or other accessories are included.

#### Hallicrafters SX-42 Radio w/matching R-42 Speaker \$75

This is a 6 band 15 tube AM receiver covering 540KHz to 100MHz. Receives FM from 27-100MHz. It includes a built-in 120v power supply. The inner tuning knob is missing. A peek inside does not show any missing parts. The radio has not been plugged-in due to it's age. It's in good physical shape but is untested.

This sale also includes the rare and desirable R-42 speaker, also in good physical shape, but untested.

One new member, Daniel . Did not get his call. KD8KTG, Bill Fraser, won the membership drawing. Adjourned at 8:27 (9:27)




#### **TECH CLASSES UNDERWAY**
