POSTAGE RATE REMINDER

Don't forget, on January 29, rates to send that QSL card will rise. First class letters will cost 46 cents, though "Forever" stamps can still be used regardless of when they were bought. Postcards will rise a penny to 33 cents.

Mailing to a DX country goes up a nickel, to \$1.10. The big news is that rates to Canada and Mexico also jump to \$1.10.

Barring any last-minute change, now is the last month ever to buy International Reply Coupons (IRCs). The US Postal Service is seeking to do away with IRCs, since they sell so few. Existing IRCs will continue to be honored by USPS and other post offices around the world.

A bit closer to home, postage rates in Canada are also rising. If you have a source of Canadian stamps so you can send an SASE to VE-land, put \$1.10 CDN postage on the envelope.

A DX bulletin replaces or is added to the regular bulletins between 0100 UTC (8 PM EST) Thursdays and 0100 UTC (8 PM EST) Fridays.

In a communications emergency, monitor W1AW for special bulletins as follows: Voice on the hour, Digital at 15 minutes past the hour and CW on the half hour.

Visiting operators: bring your current license with you.

LOTW STATUS

As noted last month, ARRL has had problems with Logbook of the World (LOTW). These are fixed, but an outage created backlog problems. Now, users can check the backlog at http://www.arrl.org/logbook-queue-status.

ARRL promised that equipment would be upgraded to handle the unexpectedly high volume of log postings, and reduce the backlog. Over the last month, though, the backlog has actually increased. On January 1, it stood at 11 days, 8 hours. So LOTW users will have to wait a while longer for improvements.

FCC NEWS

As part of a large package of rules changes, the FCC has proposed making amateur radio the primary user of 1900-2000 KHz in the 160 meter band, since this band is no longer used for navigation. Amateurs already have exclusive use of 1800-1900 KHz.

The FCC also proposed creating a new band at 135.7-137.8 kHz, with maximum radiated power of 1 watt. This will be the first time in decades that hams will be allowed to operate on LW. These frequencies are also used for controlling large power company equipment, so amateur operation would be on a non-interference basis.

ARRL has filed a petition for an amateur band at 472-479 KHz (600 meters), 5 watts ERP, as allocated by the WRC-12 international conference.


