PRESIDENT'S QRM



Its April, meaning June will be here before you realize it. In June, HPARC participates in a national event called Field Day. "Field Day is part educational event, part operating event, part public relations event – and ALL about FUN" states ARRL. I agree.

Last year we set up operating stations for a variety of bands, 10, 15, 20 40, 80 and 6 meters as well as a Get On The Air (spoken as the GOTA) station. We operated Phone, CW and digital for 24 hours straight. Considering the size of the club, the attendance was moderately small.

This is the time when Technicians have the opportunity to work and gain the experience of HF at its finest hours. This is also the time to learn about antennas, as well as, bring your own concoctions and give them a try.

My first Field Day with the club, 15 years ago, afforded me the opportunity to raise a 170 foot 70 meter vertical using helium balloons as the means to get the elevation. Not only that, but 120 1/8 lambda radials were spread out for the ground plane. I was new to the HF lower bands; I never realized the punch the antenna portrayed until a few years later when I put up my own 75 meter in

QSL CUBA DIRECT

The US Postal Service is now delivering mail directly to Cuba, as part of the general thaw in relations between the USA and Cuba. So QSL cards sent there will no longer travel via third countries.

There's still a catch. You can't just send "green stamps" with a card to pay for return postage. The USPS still prohibits sending cash in letters to Cuba. So the alternatives remain sending IRCs, donations via PayPal, and using a QSL manager in another country. The QSL Bureau works, too.

FROM THE DART:

Hope you are using Echolink on the 440 side of the DART! When we added IRLP to the machine a while ago, it came with the option to add Echolink pretty easily. What wasn't so easy was getting a callsign associated with it; we already use W8HP/R for the 2 meter machine, so that was out.

We decided that the club call, W8JXU would be appropriate, and started the paperwork to get that going. If you've ever registered for Echolink under your own callsign, you know its not too difficult--the Echolink people just want you to prove that you own the callsign and are actually a licensed ham radio operator. Its a little more difficult when its a club, because you have to be the trustee of the call. So who is the trustee of W8JXU? Our very own Bill/N8QVS. As it turns out, the callsign had to be renewed this year, and we were able to accomplish getting the callsign renewed and set up Echolink under W8JXU with some additional paperwork.

Speaking of Bill, he's going to be doing some antenna work at the south remote receive site as soon as this weather decides to stay warm. We've never had a proper tower for both antennas there, and the current setup leaves a lot to be desired. Bill will provide some tower pieces and get the antennas upright again. If you'd like to assist him, I'm sure he'd appreciate the help!

We are always looking to improve the repeater, and one thing we are considering is the Yaesu DR-1 144/430 Dual Band C4FM/FM Digital Repeater. It allows for both analog and digital transmissions, and is relatively inexpensive. See more information about it here:


