GENERAL MEETING

The next meeting of the Hazel Park Amateur Radio Club will be held on Wednesday, April 11, at 7:30 PM. Socializing starts around 7:00 PM. We meet at UFCW Hall, 876 Horace Brown Dr, Madison Heights. The location is south of 13 Mile Rd, between John R and the I-75 freeway. Turn south at the stoplight at Barrington St, then just before the dead end sign, turn right onto Horace Brown Dr. Parking is in the first lot on the left. Enter the building on the east side.

This month David Koch AA8IK will present "Mobile Radio Installation From an OEM Perspective." Most of us think of a car as a source of 12 volts DC, and a valuable possession we should drill the fewest holes in when mounting a mobile rig and antenna. David will take a deeper look at how to fit mobile radios properly into a vehicle's mechanical and electrical systems. David had a 41-year engineering career at General Motors, including work on the development of the Cadillac CTS Super Cruise hands-free driving system. David has been a ham since 1976, and is HPARC's Second Vice President. He enjoys experimenting with antennas, and operating CW and digital modes such as PSK31.

This month we will also nominate candidates for club officers and directors.

FEBRUARY 2018 MEETING MINUTES

Meeting called to order by 2nd vp David Koch at 7:39pm. Pledge of allegiance said

Introductions

Aaron W8VIP on club merchandise- gave details and proposed pricing on jackets & shirts.

Presentations:

Bill N8QVS on installing PL259 connectors Les KF8UU on attracting youth to ham radio. Suggests activities at swap- soldering, etc.

Discussion of youth presentation:

Jerry W9NPI on education - KE8ITV passed Technician exam at swap. Opportunity came up- email from parents-brothers kids ->Girl Scouts radio merit badge ->STEAM academy in Farmington hills, want to do after school program to do ham things. Elmers and others needed, just as Les described.

Don AB8RH - I don't live here, but train people in Thailand... as a kid very few people interested. Maybe crystal radios? Took HPARC classes back years ago, in days needed Morse code. Now first American to take Thai general exam. Takes sacrifice to do. Kids interested, but we need to reach out! Discussion. K8BIO Ken maybe start at Hoover elementary? Ken AD8M - in 70s electronics class for the community at schools, worked well, but tried again recently and principals said would charge for the room... John AA8UU crystal radio is tricky, issues with kits working and limited time to do them (1 hour for example). Don-Maybe start with Merit badges in radio for scouts. Mike N8BBC - There is an ARRL article on scouts from Nevada this week. Aaron W8VIP Start with the FH school, and maybe ask principal to ask principals of other schools. Ken AD8M need to go where kids are (need familiar place and no transportation), and need plan (curriculum, presenters with experience, etc lined up).

Break for Coffee / Donuts.

N8REL - Treasurer's report- Swap turned out well, we were worried last month; the post office didn't send alerts that things were delivered to the post office box. Hugh made lots of calls, and overall, 82 tables sold in the end. This year \$3,204 income, expense were only \$1,149 (since we only used half the hall), so a profit of \$2,090 on swap, which is a little better than last year. Overall - \$3,380 income, most of expenses were earlier, \$351 in expenses for January, now YTD we are \$273 in deficit, but that is mostly money spent on the repeater.

W8VIP- Thank you to KE8BED Hugh for the swap!
N8REL and KD8TBC are net control for the Sunday night
net on the DART repeater. We get regular call-ins from far
off places using EchoLink. We encourage all of you,
especially new Techs, to call in each week


