Board to present a budget to the membership at the next meeting.

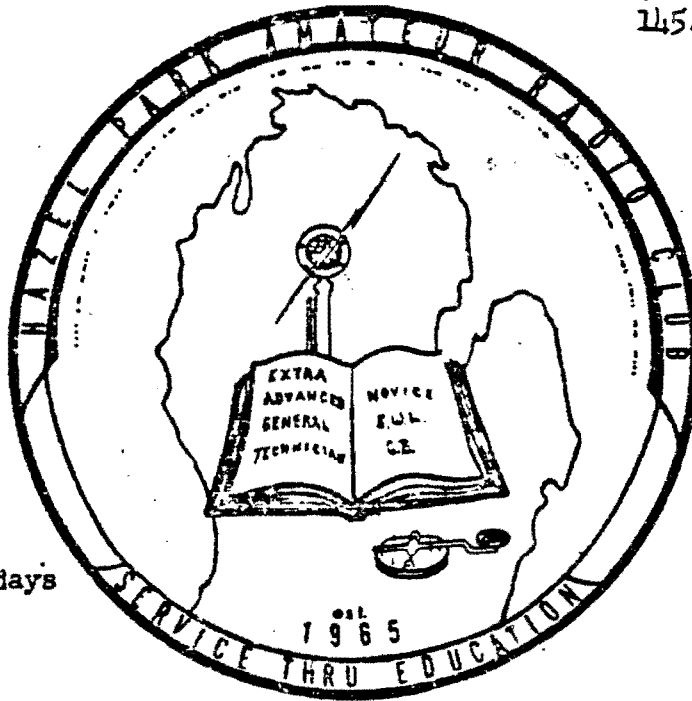

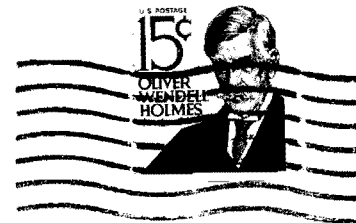
