I read an interesting article on Detroit Area Amateur Radio Council (DAARC) in the SEMARA Newsletter written by Max K8DYI. I will have to agree with Max that there are quite a few members in our club, including myself, that know very little of what the DAARC is or what their goals are. So I have taken this opportunity to copy in part some of the article.

A bit of History first: The original Council was formed back in the fifties with a speaker on RFI, none other than Bill Orr, W6SAI from Menlo Park, CA. If you look at many antenna books, you know who is the leading authority. Also, Bill publishes a handbook for Amateurs.

The present "Detroit Area Amateur Radio Council" was reactivated on April 19, 1977 "To present a united front on matters of interest to its member clubs." The Council is not to be construed as a "super" club, but only as a means of cooperation between the Amateur organizations in the area. (Note the use of the word "organizations." Several repeater groups and RACES belong.)

The monthly meetings of the Council are open to all. Anyone interested may attend; however, each member organization has one vote only. HPARC does belong to the Council with Gil K8CQM as our delegate. He can name a stand-in when he can't attend a meeting.

At present, there are twenty-three groups in the Council.

The following are the suggested activities for the consideration of the Council at the time it was reactivated: Coordination and publicizing the Code and Theory classes of the area clubs; coordination of club Swap and Shops; RFI-TVI problems; a central information bureau for the dissemination of information relating to Amateur Radio activities in the area; a possible future Michigan convention; emergency alerts and community service activities; response to local, state and national legislation; response to publicity in the media; area contests; response to FCC proposals and actions; WARC-79; exchange of ideas on all Amateur matters; i.e., club programs, projects and other activities. At present the Council is setting up a central bureau for "ham ads" to be disseminated to the various clubs for inclusion in their bulletins. The possibility of an Amateur station at the Detroit Science Center and at the State Fair in the fall. A TVI committee to be composed of experts on the subject. Another suggestion made at the meeting was a Detroit area news letter for the participation of all the clubs. Several are now have them to replace the numerous bulletins in the past. There is one in the Washington, D.C. area and also one for all of Florida. Both are outstanding publications covering all Amateur activities.

From the foregoing, you can see that the Council is trying to get rolling and does have some ambitious projects rolling. However, it does need the active interest of all the member organizations to stay viable and to progress.

Let me mention again that the meetings are open to all Amateurs that may have an interest in the Council activities. HPARC should make sure that a delegate from the club is present at each meeting. Also a report of the Council activities should be included in the HPARC Bulletin when applicable.

I'm sure Gil would appreciate it if someone would volunteer to help.

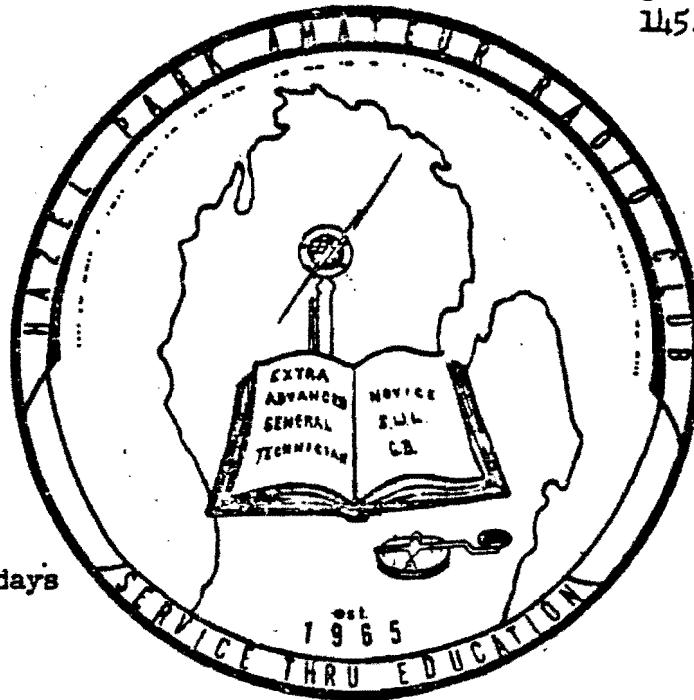
John WD8AYW made a motion and was seconded to add to the by-laws that we draw up a budget each year by January for the following year. This must be voted on at the meeting.

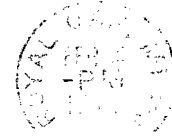
