"HAMS TUNE IN ON COMMUNITY SERVICE"

We again send the call to all Hazel Park Amateur Radio Club members and their ham radio friends. To participate, at the Oak Apple Run, as Amateur Radio operators in community service.

We will want amateur's with HANDHELDS or radio equipped AUTOMOBILES to help at Medical Team locations and assignments at individual street intersections. If you do not have a handheld or mobile unit you can be of assistance to another appropriately equipped amateur.

The amateur's priority is its radio communication, through Net Control Center, to help Medical Team locations should runners go down. To help in keeping cars off the course during Apple Run and reporting unusual circumstances requiring assistance. You need not pass out water to the runners. Those assigned to the Medical Team members merely make available ice and water for their use.

Yellow police barrier ribbons are along the course prior to the race. Amateur operators will receive additional police ribbons for use at intersections prior to the race starting. Numerous streets will be blocked off during the race and will create unhappy persons wanting access. First and foremost be a DIPLOMATIC HAM!

A preliminary meeting will be held Friday evening June 3, 1994, 6:30 PM. At First United Methodist Church of Royal Oak, 320 W. 7th St., [between Washington Ave. and Lafayette Street], Royal Oak, Michigan. Volunteers should be at this meeting for final instructions.
