DART: Moving Ahead

Lots of news this month! Alex, KC8TGW, and John, AA8UU, spent most of their Saturday installing the new remote receive site up near Great Lakes Crossing. This is the same system that was at Tom's house on the East Side. By the time you read this, it'll have been operational for at least a week. Let us know how it sounds and the kind of coverage it has. Don, W8PDI, was into it up near Grange Hall Road on North I-75, so maybe we can finally keep in touch with everyone at Field Day this year.

We hope to get a different courtesy tone on it, so you'll know when you are into it. Right now you can hear the difference in the squelch tail, as the main site sounds cleaner. Give us some time, and we will try to clean up these little problems.

Even bigger news is in the works. We just received tentative approval to locate a remote receive down in Romulus, near I-275 and I-94. This is all due to the work of Mike, N8FI, who took some initiative. Mike noticed that there was a huge microwave tower on the plant property where he works, and started asking about it. Turns out the system is not currently being used, and Mike asked his plant manager if we could possibly locate a remote there.

I pulled together a packet of information for Mike to present to his plant manager, which consisted of a letter from Oakland County Emergency Management, a similar letter from Marty, N8MG in Macomb County, some articles about ham operators assisting during emergencies, and a simple cover letter.

Well, guess what? They've said "Yes"!!

We still have to work out some details, but Mike and I are still amazed. I share this story with you because we need your help to locate one more site

on the East Side. The DART Board cannot do it on our own. It takes people like Mike to get the ball rolling. What I need is for someone on the East Side to help us find a good location. This could be a police or fire station, a tall apartment building—anything in the area of Mt. Clemens, Shelby, Utica, St. Clair Shores, or Fraser. We aren't being too picky about sites. My thinking about it is this: Let's get something in place, and then work to improve it.

Some other good news: Willy, KC8FNQ, heard my call for assistance and suggestions on battery backup for the DART 2 meter, and donated a new battery specifically designed for backup use. Alex has the battery, and we are in the process of getting the charge controller we need for it. Backup power is our biggest priority right now; to get these remote sites, we sell the DART as a backup to the Oakland County system, which is what it is. Sure, the DART is a great place to catch up with friends and club members, but if we go down during a power outage, then we are not fulfilling our primary responsibility.

It's the generosity of the DART and HPARC members that make us stronger. Follow the lead of Mike and Willie—they've gone out of their way to help. Without your support and contributions—money and otherwise, we can't accomplish much. I'd like to thank all of you who use the DART and pay dues to keep us up and running. Let me know what we at the DART Board can do to make it work better for you!
